The proposal is to construct building and additional Ripepi Funeral Home, 5784 Pearl Rd. A 20' rear setback to the adjacent residential district is required per the schedule of yard and height requirements. The proposal is a 4' 7" rear setback from residential district. This variance would result in 15'5" less rear setback from residential district. The PPN is 442-29-014 & 442-31-027 & 029. The essential character of the neighborhood would not be substantially altered and the adjoining properties would not suffer a substantial detriment as a result of this variance. The spirit and intent behind the Zoning Board requirements would be observed and substantial justice be done by granting this variance.

Councilwoman Lime – Asked why the Exhibit did not have a dollar amount.
Safety Director O'Malley – Stated that when they created the part-time dispatch position, they did not indicate what the wage rate should be. The issue is that the part-time ordinance will not have to be amended every time a new contract comes in. As the Union workers continue to get their pay raises per their union agreement, the part time workers will be awarded the same.

Mr. Miller – Stated it was brought to the Law Department's attention that there was no authority to give the one part-time dispatcher any particular amount. They are amending the legislation so that they are making the same amount that the full timers are, only on a part-time basis.

Safety Director O'Malley – Stated that there are also steps on the legislation. Councilwoman Lime – Asked if they are eligible for benefits?

Safety Director O'Malley – Stated if they work under 30 hours, they do not.
Councilwoman Lime – Asked if that was in writing?
Safety Director O'Malley – Stated it will be up to the OPBA Dispatcher's Union.
Mr. Miller – Stated that this is a timing issue, because right now they are not part of the Union. They don't know if the part timers will ever be part of the Union, but there has to be a way for the Auditor to pay them. So, right now, they are Schedule "A" Employees.

Councilwoman Lime - Asked if Council will have the final say on sale.
Mayor DeGeeter – Stated that there still needs to be a final deal that comes back before Council. They are looking to market three out of the four towers. There will be a follow up piece of legislation to Council.

Councilwoman Lime – Asked why the legislation is under Suspension?

Mayor DeGeeter- Stated that it is coming towards the end of the year and they utilize the money for the Budget this year. They are very close to final deals and final offers. They are utilizing the PCIC as the vehicle to get the deal done. Once Council passes the legislation, they can go back to the consultant, get those final deals done and come back to Council.

Councilwoman Lime – Asked what happens if Council doesn't like the proposals. Stated that she has a situation on Snow Road that has been going on for a year. How do they make sure the residents are protected.

Mayor DeGeeter – Stated that the PCIC is just the agent for the City. The City still has control. Stated that Councilwoman Lime is talking about newer technology that is separate from this issue.

Councilwoman Lime – Asked how do they know that the newer technology is not going to happen with the cell phone towers in the neighborhoods? Feels Council is losing control as the legislative body. Is concerned over the urgency and they are going to miss something. There will be an issue where the new technology is going to go on one of the cell phone towers and they will have a neighborhood that is buzzing and there is nothing that can be done.

Mr. Miller – Stated that last year when they transferred the funds from the sale of the library to the general fund, those were important funds for Council to use in the 2014 Budget. They are doing the same thing here. The same process is being used. The Administration is going to sell an asset, which is the future revenue from the cell towers that already exist. That asset is going into the PCIC, just like it did with the sale of the funds from the library and its going to be transferred into the general fund. The urgency is, Council in their projections for their budget this year, were relying upon these funds. They took those into account. The urgency is, it has to be done by the end of the year for budgeting purposes.

Councilwoman Lime- Stated that she understands that, but her concerns are, are we selling them, are we leasing them, are they five year leases, are we selling them permanently? There are many unanswered questions moving forward. She also raises the issue about the new technology. Stated that she assumes whoever is looking to lease or buy the towers, is going to use the most updated newest technology out there and are we going to have neighborhoods that are buzzing.

Mr. Brennan – Stated that Council will be voting on the final contracts. So, they will have to read the language and he is sure the Law Department will take a close look at it to anticipate any of the changes that might occur in the future to protect the City.

Mayor DeGeeter – Stated that it will be laid out and there will be a presentation made on how they arrived at the number, who bid on it, how do we solicit, etc. This is just a vehicle to allow for the process for the deal to be done. What Councilwoman Lime is talking about with the newer technology is separate from the large cell towers. Stated that all of the communities are dealing with that and there are no regulations set. They put them in the right of ways on the telephone poles. Stated that will need to be addressed, but it is a separate issue.

Councilwoman Lime – Stated that she has a situation on Snow Road near W. 54th Street where a cell tower was put on a utility pole. They are all over the City. The one on Snow Road buzzes on phones, TV's and computers. The City and the PUCO are involved but it continues.

Auditor Kish – Stated that they are selling are the future receivables. They are not selling towers. They are getting present value on future receivables.

Councilwoman Lime – Stated that she understands they are selling the receivables, but she is concerned with what is being put on the towers and she wants to make sure they are not technology that is going to hurt the neighborhoods.

Councilman Crossman – Stated that this deal only relates to the sale of future receivables. The technology is changing so fast that now is the time to sell. If the City is going to get the benefit out of the towers, it is going to be now. These towers become obsolete very quickly and the value is in selling the receivables now.

Councilman Tuma – Stated that with respect to PCIC, it's almost an arm of the administration. So, they are going to have a say and control over what is going on with the parcels and if there are any issues, they are going to address them. If they don't, Council will see to it that the Administration does. With respect to the towers, he will be asking for an Executive Session in the coming weeks so they can get an update.
