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### **COMMUNICATIONS, PETITIONS AND CLAIMS:**

THE PARMA BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS met on Thursday November 16, 2023, at 6:30 pm and PROPOSED TO VARY, subject to the provisions of amended Ordinance Section 1127.13 (confirmation or rejection by Council within forty days of receipt of this notice) FOR THE APPLICANT Kristine King (trustee) for 1350 Old Rockside Rd. Parma, Ohio 44134, PPN 445-15-014. After discussion George Mastrobuono recommends to Council to grant to Kristine King (trustee) for 1350 Old Rockside, an area variance with the stipulation requiring the installation of a 30 foot long buffer on the west side of the driveway as close to the garage as possible to City of Parma Codified Ordinance Section 1153.03 ACCESSORY USES AND BUILDINGS (d) Parking of Recreational Vehicles (2) Regulations which states, No person shall park or store recreational equipment on any street or highway or public or private property within the City except as hereinafter provided. Any owner of recreational equipment may park or store such equipment, not more than twenty-four feet in overall length. The proposal is to park and store a 27-foot-long RV at a residence. The variance would result in an RV 3 feet longer than code allows to be parked and stored in a residential district. John Yurkiw second the motion. Michelle Green, John Yurkiw, and George Mastrobuono voted to recommend to grant this variance. George Ziefle voted no.

Motion made by Councilman Euerle seconded by Councilman Casselberry to thereafter read the variance application by title only. Further moved to refer the Variance to the Planning Committee. Motion carried.

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THE PARMA BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS met on Thursday November 16, 2023, at 6:30pm and PROPOSED TO VARY, subject to the provisions of amended Ordinance Section 1127.13 (confirmation or rejection by Council within forty days of receipt of this notice) FOR THE APPLICANT Brilliant Electric Sign Co. for 5620 Hauserman Road, Parma, Ohio 44130, PPN 442-48-001. After discussion John Yurkiw recommends to Council to grant the following variance to Brilliant Electric Sign Co. for Saint Bridge of Kildare Parish, 5620 Hauserman, an area variance of the City of Parma Codified Ordinance Section 1196.06 SIGNS IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS. (a) Permitted Types, Number, Area and Height Per the Residential District Sign Schedule which states a community facility is permitted one major free-standing sign no more than 5 feet in height and a minor free-standing sign of no more than 4 Sq. Ft. in area. The proposal is to construct a major free-standing sign 6'-1/2" in height and a minor free-standing sign, 6 Sq. Ft. in area.

These variances would result in a church being permitted to construct a major free-standing sign 1'-1/2" taller, and a minor free-standing sign 2 Sq. Ft more in area than code allows. Michelle Green second the motion. George Mastrobuono, George Ziefle, Michelle Green, and John Yurkiw voted yes.

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THE PARMA BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS met on Thursday November 16, 2023, at 6:30 pm and PROPOSED TO VARY, subject to the provisions of amended Ordinance Section 1127.13 (confirmation or rejection by Council within forty days of receipt of this notice) FOR THE APPLICANT Derek Schafer, West Creek Conservancy for 7777 West Pleasant Valley, Parma, Ohio 44130, PPN: 455-24-002. After discussion Michelle Green recommends to Council to grant Derek Schafer of West Creek Conservancy, a use variance with the stipulation that split rail fencing be installed between the applicant and eastern neighbor's property, to City of Parma Codified Ordinance Section 1153.02 PRINCIPAL USES AND BUILDINGS, which states within any Single-Family House District, no building or premises shall be erected, used, arranged, or designed to be. The proposal is to use the property for educational purposes regarding watershed stewardship programming. The variance would result in allowing this parcel to be used for office and educational purposes. George Mastrobuono second the motion. John Yurkiw, George Ziefle, George Mastrobuono, and Michelle Green voted yes.

Safety Director Coury – Stated, currently the City of Parma is responsible for maintaining the Stumph at the Academy school 20 mph and flashing sign. The City of Parma Heights wishes to and has installed their own speed camera on their side of the jurisdiction. Stated because they want to do that and cities will often trade jurisdiction, we believe it is in our interest to turn over the entire maintenance of the sign, their reparations, etc., because of the fact that they want to have their speed zone camera. Since those need to be in sync, we felt it was in our interest to make them take over the entire installation.
