

TAX AND CREDIT RATES

- The City of Parma has a 2.5% city income tax with a 100% credit up to 2% for city taxes paid to another community.
- Every resident 18 years of age or older and not retired is required to file a City of Parma Annual Tax Return.
- The Tax Department oversees the swift and accurate collection of income taxes.
- The City of Parma DOES NOT tax Social Security or pensions.

IMPORTANT DATES



- **February 13, 2020** - Electronic Tax Filing classes at Parma City Hall from 6-7
- **April 15, 2020** - Filing deadline to file forms and pay remaining taxes owed to Parma.
- **January 15, 2021** - 90% of tax owed for year 2020 should be paid to the city.

Tax Department Extended Hours

The Tax Department is open daily, Monday through Friday, from 8:30am to 4:30pm.

The Tax Department will be open from 8:30am to 6:30pm on April 2, 7, 9, and 14 as well as tax day April 15th.

PREPARING AND FILING YOUR ANNUAL RETURN



Three ways to file your annual return:

1. Online (see the City of Parma website for tutorial video.)
2. Mail your completed tax form using the enclosed envelope along with all W2s, 1099s etc.
3. File in person for FREE.
Make sure to bring all W2s, 1099s etc.
Be prepared to stand in line if you wait till the filing deadline.

ATTENTION

PER HOUSE BILL 5, PASSED IN DECEMBER 2014, 90% OF YOUR ESTIMATED TAXES MUST BE PAID BY JANUARY 15 OF THE NEXT YEAR. QUARTERLY ESTIMATES ARE DUE ON APRIL 15, JUNE 15, SEPTEMBER 15, AND JANUARY 15.

Change in filing due date for employment withholding.

Withholding remittance and payment must be received no later than the 30th of the month for quarterlies and 15th of the month for monthlies.

Change in monthly and quarter withholding threshold.

Employers must remit monthly if withholding in the previous calendar year exceeded \$2,399 or if the amount required to be withheld during any month of the previous calendar quarter exceeded \$200.

Employers can remit quarterly if their withholding are under the threshold described for monthly filers.

Change in penalty and interest rates.

Late filing penalty is \$25/month per return (capped at \$150/return) regardless of liability. The penalty is one-time \$500 for casino operators and lottery sales agents.

Late payment penalty on withholding is a one-time 50% penalty of the unpaid balance at the time payment is due.

Late payment penalty on unpaid income tax and unpaid estimated income tax is a one-time 15% of the amount not timely paid.

Interest will be calculated at the July federal short-term interest rate plus 7%. For 2019 returns, paid in 2020, the monthly interest rate is: .58%

As your Parma Treasurer, I am dedicated to providing you with courteous and professional service, while maintaining an efficient and productive tax department. My staff and I are here to help you with your tax filing needs. You may reach our Tax Department via e-mail at taxoffice@cityofparma-oh.gov or by phone at 440-885-8045.

To make things easier, please remember that the Tax Department will have extended hours on Tuesdays and Thursdays, beginning April 2nd and lasting until the tax filing deadline Wednesday April 15th. Taxpayers will need to bring the following items with them to the tax office: Pre-printed tax form, which will be mailed in January, All W-2s, 1099s, relevant schedules, etc., and proof of payment to other cities, if necessary. We recommend that you come in prior to the last week of filing to avoid long lines.

The Parma Tax Department also offers online filing through Tax Connect which is being upgraded this year to better serve your needs. The tax department online filing can be located at www.cityofparma-oh.gov. You can check and see what payments and /or credits you have on your current or past tax years. You are also able to complete, efile, and if needed pay your taxes online. Call us at 440-885-8045 or e-mail us at taxoffice@cityofparma-oh.gov if you have any questions. Prior to the first of April you can call us for assistance with your efile and help with your tax form. More complicated returns may have to be completed at our office.

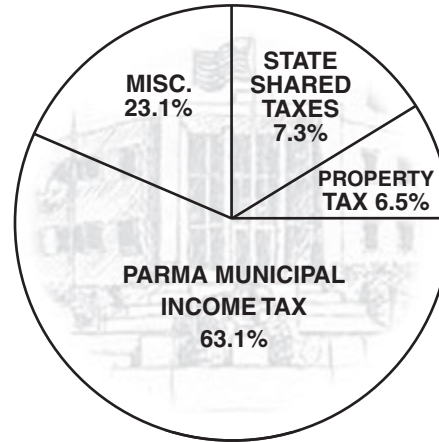

CITY GENERAL FUND REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

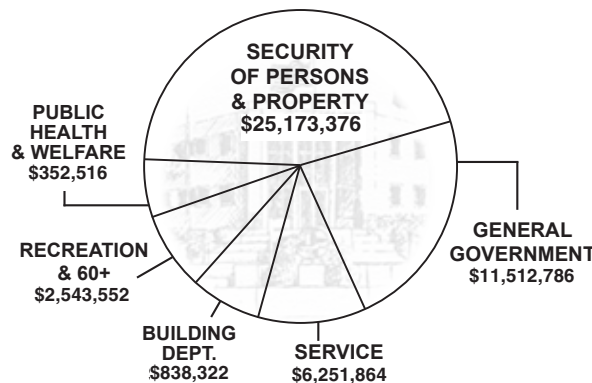
REVENUE



The City of Parma receives a majority of its operating money from City Income Tax. Miscellaneous income includes interest earned, licenses, permits & fees.

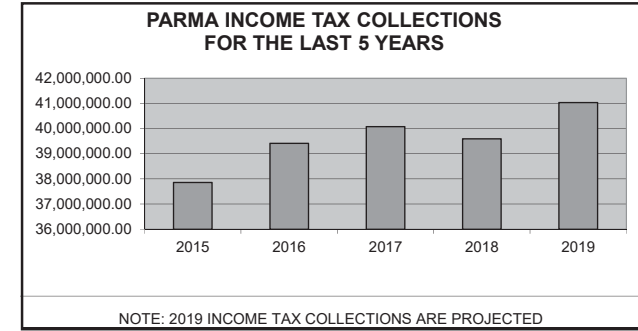
EXPENDITURES

Safety and Service expenditures account for approximately 67.33 percent of the city's general fund expenses.

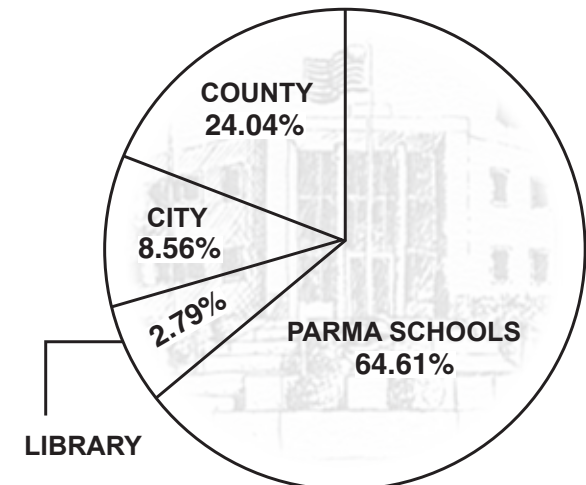

PROPERTY TAX INFORMATION

The City of Parma has one of the lowest municipal portions of property tax rates in Cuyahoga County. Parma is the seventh largest city in Ohio and has the lowest budget of all major cities in Ohio.

The total residential real estate effective tax rate is 81.05 mills per \$1,000 asset valuation. Of this amount, the City of Parma tax rate is \$6.90 per \$1,000 assessed valuation. This is based off of effective tax rate.
