TAX AND CREDIT RATES

- The City of Parma has a 2.5% city income tax with a 100% credit up to 2% for city taxes paid to another community.
- Every resident 18 years of age or older and not retired is required to file a City of Parma Annual Tax Return.
- The Tax Department oversees the swift and accurate collection of income taxes.
- The City of Parma DOES NOT tax Social Security or pensions.



- After March 29, 2024 Tax Department will only receive drop offs. We will not prepare tax return while you wait.
- April 15, 2024 Filing deadline to file forms and pay remaining taxes owed to Parma.
- December 15, 2024 90% business taxes owed for year 2023 should be paid to the city.
- January 15, 2025 90% personal taxes owed for year 2024 should be paid to the city.

Tax Department Extended Hours (Drop off only)

The Tax Department is open daily, Monday through Friday, from 8:30am to 4:30pm.

The Tax Department will be open from 8:30am to 6:30pm on April 2, 4, 9, and 11 as well as tax day April 15th.



Four ways to file your annual return:

- 1. Online at Tax Connect Online
- 2. Mail your completed tax form using the enclosed envelope along with all W2s, schedules, 1099s etc.
- 3. Mail in your tax documents- Tax Dept will complete your return and send you a copy.
- 4. File in person for FREE. Up to March 29, 2024 we will prepare your tax form while you wait.

ATTENTION

Change in monthly and quarterly withholding threshold.

Employers must remit <u>monthly</u> if withholding in the previous calendar year exceeded \$2,399 or if the amount required to be withheld during any month of the previous calendar quarter exceeded \$200.

Employers can remit <u>quarterly</u> if their withholding are under the threshold described for monthly filers.

Change in penalty and interest rates.

Late filing penalty is \$25/month per return (capped at \$150/return) regardless of liability. The penalty is one-time \$500 for casino operators and lottery sales agents.

Late payment penalty on withholding is a onetime 50% penalty of the unpaid balance at the time payment is due.

Late payment penalty on unpaid income tax and unpaid estimated income tax is a one-time 15% of the amount not timely paid.

Interest will be calculated at the July federal short-term interest rate plus 5%. For 2023 returns, paid in 2024, the monthly interest rate is: .83%

Taxpayers will need to send the following items into the tax department or bring in after March 29, 2024: Preprinted tax form, which will be mailed in January, all W-2s, 1099s, relevant schedules, etc., and proof of payments to other cities, if necessary.





The City of Parma receives a majority of its operating money from City Income Tax. Miscellaneous income includes interest earned, licenses, permits & fees.


EXPENDITURES

PROPERTY TAX INFORMATION

The City of Parma has one of the lowest municipal portions of property tax rates in Cuyahoga County. Parma is the seventh largest city in Ohio and has the lowest budget of all major cities in Ohio.

The total residential real estate effective tax rate is 71.01 mills per \$1,000 assessed valuation. Of this amount, the City of Parma tax rate is \$6.24 per \$1,000 assessed valuation. This is based off of effective tax rate.
