

ORDINANCE NO. 59-14

AN ORDINANCE TO EXTEND THE MORATORIUM FOR AN ADDITIONAL THIRTY (30) DAYS ON THE GRANTING OF ANY PERMITS ALLOWING THE OPERATION OF BUSINESSES ENGAGING IN LOANS ON VEHICLE TITLES WITHIN THE CITY OF PARMA, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Constitution of the State of Ohio and the Ohio Revised Code, municipalities have the power to enact planning and zoning laws that are for the health, safety, and welfare, comfort and peace of the citizens of the municipality, including restricting areas uses for businesses and trades; and,

WHEREAS, the current moratorium, authorized by Ordinance No. 242-13, adopted October 7, 2013, will expire on or about April 7, 2014, and it is the intent of the City to extend this moratorium for an additional thirty (30) days from the present expiration date; and;

WHEREAS, this Council desires to continue to withhold the issuance of any permits to businesses or individuals allowing for the operation of businesses engaging in loans on vehicle titles for an additional thirty (30) days, while it undertakes a review and/or study of the Ordinances of the City of Parma, including the zoning, building and business regulation sections of the Parma Codified Ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, this Council will be able to enact reasonable regulations to protect the health, safety, welfare, peace and comfort for the citizens of the City of Parma more effectively if an extension of the moratorium is in place;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARMA, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Council hereby approves an additional thirty (30) day extension on the moratorium on the granting of any permits allowing the operation of businesses engaging in loans on vehicle titles within the City of Parma, with said extension to expire on or about May 7, 2014.

Section 2. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare of the City of Parma, and for the further reason that this measure is necessary in order to extend this moratorium in a timely manner, and this Ordinance shall become immediately effective upon receiving the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council and approval of the Mayor, otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
