AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 660.31  
“VEHICLES” and 1707.15 “VEHICLES” OF THE PARMA  
CODIFIED ORDINANCES, AND DECLARING AN  
EMERGENCY

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PARMA, STATE OF OHIO ORDAINS:

Section 1. Existing section 660.31 “Vehicles” of the Parma Codified Ordinances is hereby amended to provide as set forth in Exhibit “A” attached hereto, with deleted text stricken through and added text in boldface and underscored:

Section 2. Existing section 1707.15 “Vehicles” of the Parma Codified Ordinances is hereby amended to provide as set forth in Exhibit “B” attached hereto, with deleted text stricken through and added text in boldface and underscored:

Section 3. That only that portion of section 606.31 “Vehicles” and section 1707.15 “Vehicles” of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Parma, as they existed heretofore, are hereby repealed.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of the Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare. The reason for such necessity is the City must further regulate junk vehicles and unlicensed vehicles in order to effectively protect property from blight conditions created by such vehicles. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into immediate effect upon receiving the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council and approval of the Mayor, otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
