Parcels requiring Use Variance — 449-04-025-060-061. The stipulation is that there is no 24 hour drive-thru. The drive-thru can operate from 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight, with the applicant to be permitted to petition Council twelve months after the issuance of the occupancy permit to lift those restrictions.
